The process of **interaction and integration** among people, companies and governments worldwide

Interaction

**Communication or direct involvement** with someone or something

Integration

To **combine one thing with another** to make a whole

Social

**Relating to people**, both individuals and groups

Economic

**Relating to money** and business

Political

**Relating to governments** and the decisions they make

Culture

A set of **ideas, customs, beliefs** that a group of people hold

Investment

The **allocation of money**, with the expectation of some benefit in the future

Exploit

To make use of a situation in a way that **could be considered unfair**, that benefits one party but takes away from another

Trade

**Buying and selling** of goods and services
